

Conducted Energy Weapons (TASER)

304.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

This policy provides guidelines for the issuance and use of the TASER (TM).

304.2 POLICY

The TASER device is used to control a violent or potentially violent individual or an individual that is actively resisting arrest or detention. The appropriate use of such a device should result in fewer serious injuries to officers and suspects.

304.3 ISSUANCE AND CARRYING TASER DEVICES

Per M.G.L. c. 41 § 98, Police Officers are authorized to carry and use a variety of weapons, as authorized by the Chief of Police, at all times when on duty. Only members who have successfully completed department-approved training and have demonstrated proficiency in the use of the TASER (TM) may be issued and may carry the TASER device (501 CMR § 8.04).

TASER devices are either permanently assigned to an individual officer or are issued for use during a member's current assignment. Those leaving a particular assignment may be required to return the device to the department inventory.

Officers shall only use the TASER device and cartridges that have been issued by the Department. Uniformed officers who have been issued the TASER device shall wear the device in an approved holster. While on-duty, non-uniformed officers may secure the TASER device in the driver's compartment of their vehicles. The TASER device must be under the officers' direct control or in a locked vault or container.

Members carrying the TASER device should perform a spark test prior to every shift in the approved spark test area at the police station.

Any TASER device that is determined by a member to be malfunctioning or in need of service or repair shall not be carried. It shall be presented as soon as practicable to the member's supervisor who should arrange for repair or replacement.

Officers who carry the TASER device while in uniform shall carry it in a weak-side holster on the side opposite the duty weapon.

- (a) All TASER devices shall be clearly and distinctly marked to differentiate them from the duty weapon and any other device.
- (b) Whenever practicable, officers should carry two or more cartridges on their person when carrying the TASER device.
- (c) Officers shall be responsible for ensuring that the issued TASER device is properly maintained and in good working order.
- (d) Officers should not hold a firearm and the TASER device at the same time.

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304.4 VERBAL AND VISUAL WARNINGS

A verbal warning of the intended use of the TASER device should precede its application, unless it would otherwise endanger the safety of officers or when it is not practicable due to the circumstances. The purpose of the warning is to:

- (a) Provide the individual with a reasonable opportunity to voluntarily comply.
- (b) Provide other officers and individuals with a warning that the TASER device may be deployed.

If, after a verbal warning, an individual fails to voluntarily comply with an officer's lawful orders and it appears both reasonable and feasible under the circumstances, the officer may, but is not required to, display the electrical arc or the laser in a further attempt to gain compliance prior to the application of the TASER device. The aiming laser should not be intentionally directed into anyone's eyes.

The fact that a verbal or other warning was given or the reasons it was not given shall be documented by the officer deploying the TASER device in the related report.

304.5 USE OF THE TASER DEVICE

The TASER device has limitations and restrictions requiring consideration before its use. The TASER device should only be used when its operator can safely approach the subject within the operational range of the device. Although the TASER device is effective in controlling most individuals, officers should be aware that the device may not achieve the intended results and be prepared with other options.

304.5.1 APPLICATION OF THE TASER DEVICE

The TASER device may be used in any of the following circumstances, when the circumstances perceived by the officer at the time indicate that such application is reasonably necessary to control a person:

- (a) The subject is violent or is physically resisting.
- (b) The subject has demonstrated, by words or action, an intention to be violent or to physically resist, and reasonably appears to present the potential to harm officers, him/herself, or others.
- (c) When an individual expresses intent and has the means to commit suicide or inflict serious bodily harm to themselves or others and CEW activation does not create additional risk.

Mere flight from a pursuing officer, without other known circumstances or factors, is not good cause for the use of the TASER device to apprehend an individual.

The TASER device shall not be used to psychologically torment, to elicit statements, or to punish any individual.

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304.5.2 SPECIAL DEPLOYMENT CONSIDERATIONS

The use of the TASER device on certain individuals should be avoided unless the totality of the circumstances indicates that other available options reasonably appear ineffective or would present a greater danger to the officer, the subject, or others, and the officer reasonably believes that the need to control the individual outweighs the risk of using the device. This includes:

- (a) Individuals who are known to be pregnant.
- (b) Elderly individuals or obvious juveniles.
- (c) Individuals with obviously low body mass.
- (d) Individuals who are handcuffed or otherwise restrained.
- (e) Individuals who have been recently sprayed with a flammable chemical agent or who are otherwise in close proximity to any known combustible vapor or flammable material, including alcohol-based oleoresin capsicum (OC) spray.
- (f) Individuals whose position or activity may result in collateral injury (e.g., falls from height, operating vehicles, individuals located in or near water).

Because the application of the TASER device in the drive-stun mode (i.e., direct contact without probes) relies primarily on pain compliance, the use of the drive-stun mode should be limited to supplementing the probe-mode to complete the circuit, or as a less lethal tool to create pain compliance as a technique to gain compliance from actively resistant individuals.

304.5.3 TARGETING CONSIDERATIONS

The preferred targeting areas include the individual's back or front lower-center mass. The head, neck, chest, and groin should be avoided when reasonably practicable. If the dynamics of a situation or officer safety do not permit the officer to limit the application of the TASER device probes to a precise target area, officers should monitor the condition of the subject if one or more probes strikes the head, neck, chest, or groin until the subject is examined by paramedics or other medical personnel.

304.5.4 MULTIPLE APPLICATIONS OF THE TASER DEVICE

Officers should apply the TASER device for only one standard cycle and then evaluate the situation before applying any subsequent cycles. Officers should not intentionally apply more than one TASER device at a time against a single individual.

If the first application of the TASER device appears to be ineffective in gaining control of an individual, the officer should evaluate the situation and consider certain factors before additional applications of the TASER device, including:

- (a) Whether it is reasonable to believe that the need to control the individual outweighs the potentially increased risk posed by multiple applications.
- (b) Whether the probes are making proper contact.
- (c) Whether the individual has the ability and has been given a reasonable opportunity to comply.

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- (d) Whether verbal commands or other options or tactics may be more effective.

Each TASER (TM) deployment is considered an independent use of force and must be objectively reasonable.

304.5.5 ACTIONS FOLLOWING DEPLOYMENTS

Officers should take appropriate actions to control and restrain the individual to minimize the need for longer or multiple exposures to the TASER device. As soon as practicable, officers shall notify a supervisor any time the TASER device has been discharged. Officers shall provide the battery from the deployed TASER (TM) to a supervisor and ensure they are provided with a replacement battery.

304.5.6 DANGEROUS ANIMALS

The TASER device may be deployed against an animal as part of a plan to deal with a potentially dangerous animal, such as a dog, if the animal reasonably appears to pose an imminent threat to human safety and alternative methods are not reasonably available or would likely be ineffective.

304.5.7 OFF-DUTY CONSIDERATIONS

Officers are not authorized to carry department TASER devices while off-duty.

Officers shall ensure that TASER devices are secured while in their homes, vehicles, or any other area under their control, in a manner that will keep the device inaccessible to others.

304.6 DOCUMENTATION

Officers shall document all TASER device discharges in the related arrest/incident reports and complete a [Use of Force Report](#). Each application of the TASER device is a separate application of the use of force and a separate Use of Force Report form must be filed for each application. Pointing the device at a person, laser activation, and arcing the device, other than for testing or training purposes, will also require the completion of a Use of Force Report form.

The TASER (TM) Program Manager should also conduct audits of data downloads and reconcile the TASER device report forms with recorded activations.

304.6.1 REPORTS

The officer should include the following in the arrest/crime report:

- (a) Identification of all personnel firing TASER devices
- (b) Identification of all witnesses
- (c) Medical care provided to the subject
- (d) Observations of the subject's physical and physiological actions
- (e) Any known or suspected drug use, intoxication, or other medical problems

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304.6.2 DATA COLLECTION

The Deputy Chief of Police should periodically analyze the reports to identify trends, including deterrence and effectiveness, and should complete and submit the data collection forms to the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security's Office of Grants and Research.

304.7 MEDICAL TREATMENT

Consistent with local medical personnel protocols and absent extenuating circumstances, only appropriate medical personnel should remove TASER device probes from a person's body. Used TASER device probes shall be treated as a sharps biohazard, similar to a used hypodermic needle, and handled appropriately. Universal precautions should be taken.

All persons who have been struck by TASER device probes or who have been subjected to the electric discharge of the device or who sustained direct exposure of the laser to the eyes shall be medically assessed prior to booking. Additionally, any such individual who falls under any of the following categories should, as soon as practicable, be examined by paramedics or other qualified medical personnel:

- (a) The person is suspected of being under the influence of controlled substances and/or alcohol.
- (b) The person may be pregnant.
- (c) The person reasonably appears to be in need of medical attention.
- (d) The TASER device probes are lodged in a sensitive area (e.g., groin, female breast, head, face, neck).
- (e) The person requests medical treatment.

Any individual exhibiting signs of distress or who is exposed to multiple or prolonged applications (i.e., more than 15 seconds) shall be transported to a medical facility for examination or medically evaluated prior to booking. If any individual refuses medical attention, such a refusal should be witnessed by another officer and/or medical personnel and shall be fully documented in related reports. If an audio recording is made of the contact or an interview with the individual, any refusal should be included, if possible.

The transporting officer shall inform any person providing medical care or receiving custody that the individual has been subjected to the application of the TASER device (see the Medical Aid and Response Policy).

304.8 SUPERVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

When possible, supervisors should respond to calls when they reasonably believe there is a likelihood the TASER device may be used. A supervisor should respond to all incidents where the TASER device was activated.

A supervisor should review each incident where a person has been exposed to an activation of the TASER device. A supervisor must complete the Supervisory/Command Review section of the officer's Use of Force Report form if a TASER (TM) is deployed, including a spark

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display. The supervisor shall retrieve the battery from the deployed TASER (TM), place it in the battery charging/download station, and provide the officer that deployed the TASER (TM) with a new battery. The TASER (TM) Program Manager shall be notified, and the TASER (TM) Program Manager shall retrieve the downloaded information from the battery charging/download station. Photographs of probe sites should be taken and witnesses interviewed.

304.9 TRAINING

Personnel who are authorized to carry the TASER device shall be permitted to do so only after successfully completing the initial department-approved training and annual recertification thereafter that complies with 501 CMR § 8.05. Any personnel who have not carried the TASER device as a part of their assignments for a period of six months or more shall be recertified by a qualified TASER device instructor prior to again carrying or using the device.

Proficiency training for personnel who have been issued TASER devices should occur every year. A reassessment of an officer's knowledge and/or practical skills may be required at any time if deemed appropriate by the Certified TASER (TM) Instructor. All training and proficiency for TASER devices will be documented in the officer's training files.

Command staff, supervisors, and investigators should receive TASER device training as appropriate for the investigations they conduct and review.

Officers who do not carry TASER devices should receive training that is sufficient to familiarize them with the device and with working with officers who use the device.

The Training Officer is responsible for ensuring that all members who carry TASER devices have received initial and annual proficiency training. All proficiency training must be monitored by a certified instructor. Periodic audits should be used for verification.

Before a newly sworn officer is authorized to carry and/or use a TASER the officer is to be issued a copy of and receive instruction on this policy and the Use of Force Policy. The issuance of and instruction on these policies shall be documented.

Before an employee is authorized to carry and/or use a new TASER device, the employee is to be issued a copy of and receive instruction on this policy and the Use of Force Policy. The issuance of and instruction on these policies shall be documented.

Application of TASER devices during training could result in injuries and should not be mandatory for certification.

The Training Officer should ensure that all training includes:

- (a) A review of this policy.
- (b) A review of the Use of Force Policy.
- (c) Performing weak-hand draws or cross-draws to reduce the possibility of unintentionally drawing and firing a firearm.

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- (d) Target area considerations, to include techniques or options to reduce the unintentional application of probes near the head, neck, chest, and groin.
- (e) Handcuffing a subject during the application of the TASER device and transitioning to other force options.
- (f) De-escalation techniques.
- (g) Restraint techniques that do not impair respiration following the application of the TASER device.
- (h) Other requirements set forth in 501 CMR § 8.05.

Members who fail to demonstrate proficiency with the TASER or knowledge of the Use of Force/Conducted Energy Weapon Policy will be provided remedial training. If a member cannot demonstrate proficiency with the TASER or knowledge of the Use of Force/Conducted Energy Policy after remedial training, the member will be restricted from carrying the TASER and may be subject to discipline.

304.9 TASER INSTRUCTOR RESPONSIBILITIES

The Firearms Instructor shall maintain a record of all less lethal tools, including tasers, authorized and approved for use by officers of this department. The record will be securely filed in the Guardian Tracking System. The records will be updated annually during less lethal training, or any time a less lethal tool is turned in, an officer is separated from employment or a new officer is hired. This record shall include:

- Manufacturer & Type
- Identifying model number & serial number
- Identity of assignee
- Name of firearms instructor/armorer approving the tool
- Date of approval
- Scores used for proficiency or qualification, if applicable

Prior to being issued or authorized for use, each less lethal tool shall be approved and inspected by a department armorer or qualified instructor familiar with the tool being inspected. The tool shall be visually and physically inspected and a functions check shall be completed. The inspector shall not approve the tool for duty use unless the inspector determines that it is in good working order. Failed tools shall be removed from service and repaired or replaced.

Each tool used on duty shall be approved and inspected annually by a department armorer or qualified instructor familiar with the tool being inspected. The tool shall be visually and physically inspected and a functions check shall be completed. Whenever possible, inspections will be done in conjunction with training on that tool. The inspector shall not approve the tool for use unless the inspector determines that it is in good working order. Failed tools shall be removed from service and may be repaired or replaced. Repaired tools must be inspected prior to use.

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The inspector shall record his/her name and the date of inspection on the appropriate form. The record shall in the Guardian Tracking System.

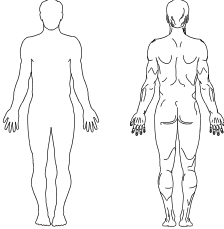
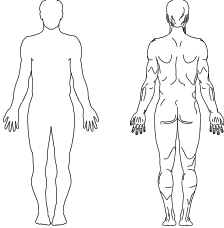
